- reinforcing a No Wrong Door approach to accessing perinatal care,

What is Welcome Baby?

If you choose to participate in the Welcome Baby program, you will receive postpartum services directly in your home or another safe location, including:

A Registered Nurse visit soon after your baby is born,

An individual care plan,


Connection to community resources,

Client support items like a onesie, baby books, and booklets on infant care,

Up to two follow-up visits from our Navigators to help you meet your goals,

A referral to Pathways services as needed.

What is Pathways to Resilience?

In addition to the services offered with Welcome Baby, Pathways to Resilience participants receive wraparound case management services for up to 18 months, including:

Monthly visits with your Navigator,

Parenting supports,

Help with transportation to/from appointments,

Care coordination that helps you address any unmet medical or mental health needs,

Connection to resources within the community you may be in need of

Additional client support items like diapers, and childproofing supplies.

Your Navigator serves as a trusted advocate for you and your family and can help connect you to services that can help you and your family reach goals and find peace.
